Students from the Department of Mechanical Engineering participated in a practical Skill Development Program. The initiative provided hands-on experience and enhanced their technical skills.

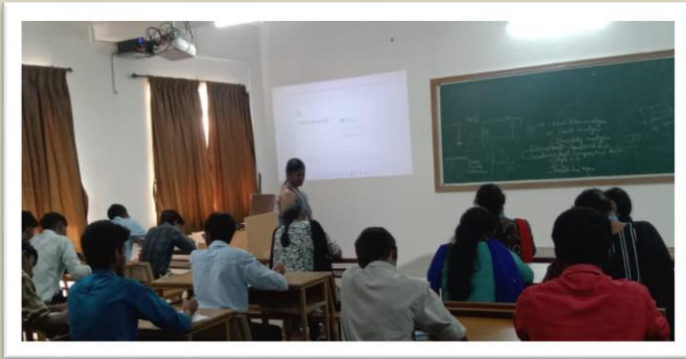


During the Skill Development Hour, the Electro Care Unit provided mobile servicing training to second-year ECE students. This session aimed to enhance their practical skills in mobile repair.



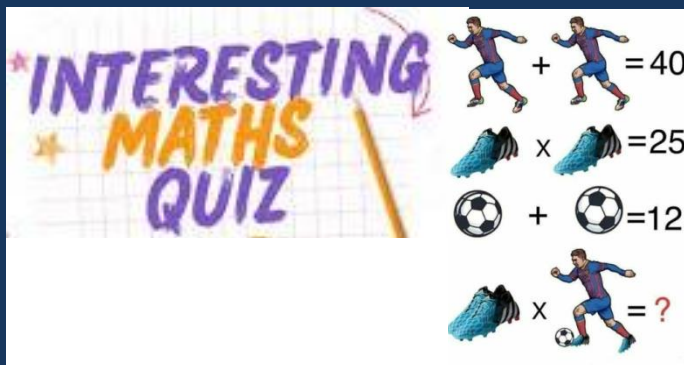
